	Today we will be again looking at the place value of numbers and trying to count bundles by 10s then adding on how many more to make up the number using our place value knowledge and prior learning.		
	When we put our bundles of 10 together we need to remember to put a band around it to make the bundle of 10 complete and form a group/bundle. The amount of bundles needed is the number in the tens column. For example: if we have the number 28. We can see that the 2 is in the tens column which means we will need to put 2 bundles of ten together.		
	Here you can see the 2 bundles of 10 which means we can count by 10s. 10, 20 so we can now see that there is some left over which are not put into a bundle. We need to count these in ones (or if you can try counting by 2s.) So we had 20 let's continue counting on the 8 ones. 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28. So we have 28 in total.


