PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

HIGH SCHOOL ORIENTATION - TUESDAY, 26TH NOVEMBER

The first full day orientation day for students in Year 6 who are attending Kadina, Lismore or Richmond River High Schools next year is on Tuesday, 26th November.

Information from the High Schools should have already been received. Students must attend the orientation day for the high school in which they have enrolled.

If you have not enrolled your child into a high school ready for Year 7 in 2025, please do so as soon as possible. Please see more information attached about the orientation day.

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION

The second week of our 2025 Kindergarten orientation program runs Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30am – 1.00pm in the Kindergarten classrooms. The program runs for 4 weeks. If you know of any pre-schoolers who will be starting school in 2025, please inform their families of our program and ask them to contact the school on 6624 1444 for details.

K-6 ASSEMBLY

We will be having a K-6 Assembly on Monday 11th November from 9.20am in the school hall. Students will receive their Silver and Gold Awards. There will be one more opportunity to collect these awards this term, so I encourage students to hand in their bronze, and silver awards quickly.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

This term, our school will be focusing on Student Attendance. Being at school is extremely important for the continuation of learning.

Students who miss days throughout the week miss lessons and vital instructions that are critical to the flow of learning – this often affects a student's confidence and has an impact on learning key concepts.

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance e.g. attending a funeral.

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options.

NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people.

When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier, and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

SMS - ABSENCES

Going to school every day is important and Kindergarten sets children up for the rest of their schooling. What your child learns each day builds on what they learned the day before.

- If your child misses' school, their learning routine is broken, so they can lose confidence and miss out on building their friendships.
- If your child misses' school due to illness, religious reasons, or family circumstances, you are required to explain the reason for their absence to the school.
- If your child arrives at school late or needs to leave early, you will need to communicate with the office to sign your child in or out and provide a reason for the absence.
- If you're having difficulty getting your child to school every day and on time, talk to your teacher or principal.
- If your child is absent for a whole day or part of a day, without a reason, you will receive an SMS from us asking you to reply to the school to explain the reason for the absence. You can reply to the SMS or simply call the school to explain the absence.

It is a Department of Education requirement that a reason be provided for all absences.

Our school recently received a grant from the Australian Tennis Foundation to run a tennis program called 'Hot Shots' over 5 weeks for our Year 3-6 classes. 
